Why does Narrator create duplicate files when I export to iTunes?

Depending on settings in iTunes, exporting a presentation to iTunes could cause duplicate copies of the file being exported.

There are two ways to remedy this:

- **Change settings in Narrator**, to export files to a location that will not cause iTunes to copy the file on import.
- **Change settings in iTunes**, to prevent iTunes from copying files when it imports them.

Overview

When iTunes imports files, it will treat the file differently, depending on where it is relative to the location **~/Music/iTunes/iTunes Music/**. If iTunes opens a file:

- **outside** of this location (for example **~/Documents/**, which is the location of your profile's Documents folder), iTunes will **make a copy** of your file when importing it.
- **inside** to this location (for example, **~/Music/iTunes/iTunes Music/Narrations/**), iTunes will **move** the file (without copying it) when importing it.

Changing export location in Narrator

- In Narrator, choose **Narrator > Preferences... > Export**.
- Under **Export Folder**, select **Choose...**
- Choose a location contained within **~/Music/iTunes/iTunes Music/** and click on **Choose**.
